Call to order: Called to order by Chairperson Nanci Howard at 7:23 pm.

Secretary's Report: In a **motion** made by Sarah Leonard and seconded by Patrick Lucas, it was **voted** unanimous to approve the minutes of December 18,2023.

Financial Report: Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual

Currently the Parks and Recreation department has spent 51% of budgeted funds, which is good at this time of year. Camp Lodge Maintenance was over budget by \$1554.55 due to emergency repairs and timing of plumbing payments. In a motion made by Sarah Leonard and seconded by Patrick Lucas, it was voted unanimous to accept the report

Old Business:

Camp Coch Day Camp Proposed Budget

In 2023/2024 Fiscal Year the revenue was \$49,605 and the expected revenue for FISCAL YEAR 2024/2025 is \$78,616. Camp fees will be \$ 195 for residents and \$ 225 for non-residents for the 2024 Camp season Hiring is on-going and a letter will be sent to Regional School District 6 for help in recruiting. A letter was sent to businesses to look for sponsors for the ice cream and pizza which is now included in the camp price.

Office Relocation to Camp Cochipianee

Reviewed responses to the Board of Selectman questions (Concern's for Moving the Recreation office over to Camp Coch), see attached. This is scheduled for review in the Board of Selectman Meeting on March 5, 2024.

New Business:

Fiscal Year 2024/2025 budget discussion.

The Board of Selectman will review the budget on 3/19/2024 and the Board of Finance on 3/22/2024. Changes for Fiscal Year 2024/2025 include a \$1000 increase for Camp Lodge Maintenance including water testing compliance. Camp supplies were reduced by \$7300 as sponsors are expected to help cut costs. Office Supplies are up \$800 and include broadband, ring cameras and MyRec Software. Overall, it is a 1.57% increase over Fiscal Year2023/2024

Capital Non-Recurring

\$28,700.00 for Capital Non-Recurring in proposed for Fiscal Year 024/2025 budget. The discussion included: \$5000 to Camp Coch Facilities Projects for replacement boiler/furnace/hot water heater (estimated \$13,000). Improved playground to be installed near the track for public and camp use at \$15,000 per year. Planning for anticipated replacement of Kobylenski Lodge roof in 20/30 years. Additional cameras around the buildings and grounds and a key fob system(\$3,700) to be installed to monitor indoor access. Track Repair maintained as numerous people utilize the track daily so track maintenance is a priority

The budget will be discussed at next meeting on March 18, 2024, before submittal to the Board of Selectman.

Adjournment: In a motion made By Susan Breakwell, seconded by Patrick Lucas, it was voted to adjourn the meeting at 8:04 p.m. Voted unanimous.
