1 Call to order: Robert P. Valentine, First Selectman called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m.

2. Approve the minutes of the March 3, 2020 Regular Meeting:

In a **motion** made by Mark S. Harris, seconded by Robert P. Valentine, it was **voted** to approve the minutes of the meeting of March 3, 2020 as submitted. Voted unanimous.

4. Approval of Payroll and Warrant - March 12, 2020:

In a **motion** made by Mark S. Harris, seconded by Robert P. Valentine, it was **voted** to approve the total warrant and payroll for March 12, 2020 in the amount of \$69,369.08. Included in this warrant were the payroll in the amount of \$24,831.45 and the warrant in the amount of \$44,537.63. Voted unanimous. Included were payments for: CIRMA (Workers Comp.) \$18,077.00; Morton Salt (Winter Salt) \$6,101.25; Yucatech (Technical Support) \$2,732.54.

6. First Selectman's Report:

Bob Valentine reported attending a meeting with Chief Elected Officials, Emergency Services and Emergency Management Directors at the TAHD (Torrington Area Health District). Leslie Polito, and others from the TAHD shared information on the Coronavirus. This meeting was very informative as to what to do to be prepared. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, (CDC) have developed protocols, i.e., thorough hand washing, keep hands away from face, refrain from personal handshakes; clean hard surfaces once a day, etc. Bob will distribute a memo citing measures to be taken by town employees.

In addition, he reported that he was a participant in a "conference" call Monday from the Governor's Office which included Chief Elected Officials, Superintendents, Department of Health and State Emergency Management personnel. Discussed was the evolving nova coronavirus, COVID 19 and recommendations on public assembly. Also discussed was the potential for the spread of COVID-19 and the evolving situation within the State.

Today at 2:25 pm the Governor issued a "Declaration of Public Health and Civil Preparedness Emergencies" throughout the State, to remain in effect through September 9, 2020, unless terminated earlier by the Governor. principles of risk management to decisions about whether to cancel, modify, or postpone large gatherings, public events, or travel."

Bob has received notice from the office of Lt. Governor Susan Bysiewicz that the Veterans Ceremony scheduled for Monday, March 16th at Camp Cochipianne has been postponed until further notice as a precaution during the coronavirus COVID 19 emergency.

Earle Tyler, Town Custodian, will be cleaning all surfaces at Town Hall on a daily basis until further notice.

Bob will be crafting a memo to town employees concerning the coronavirus COVID 19 to encourage employees to stay home if they feel ill with symptoms similar to COVID 19 or if they come in contact with some who has been confirmed to have COVID 19.

9c. A Municipal Affordable Housing Grant Application

The State of CT, Dept. of Housing has announced that they are accepting applications for planning grant funds from small municipalities, seeking to prepare and adopt an Affordable Housing Plan under the provisions of CGS 8-30j. This grant is being offered on a first-come, first-serve basis. Since Section 8-30j requires the Town to prepare an affordable housing plan, it would be in the best interest of Goshen to apply for the grant to help pay for such a plan. The Board of Selectmen must authorize submission of the grant application. Sec. 8-30j At least once every five years, each municipality will prepare or amend and adopt an affordable housing plan for the municipality. The municipality may hold public informational meetings or organize other activities to inform residents about the process of preparing the plan. Following adoption, the municipality shall regularly review and maintain such plan.

Marty Connor, Town Planner submitted a letter to the Board of Selectmen encouraging the board to apply for the grant in order to defray the cost of putting a plan together.

In a **motion** made by Mark S. Harris, seconded by Dexter Kinsella, it was **voted** to authorize First Selectman, Robert Valentine to apply for a Municipal Affordable Housing Plan Technical Assistance Grant and enter into agreement(s) as necessary to expend any funds received. Voted unanimous.
